Among his various research stays, recent notable ones include those at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative and International Private Law in Hamburg and the Commercial Law Centre, Harris Manchester College, at the University of Oxford.

Currently, Federico is an Associate Professor of Economic Law and Financial Markets Regulation at the University of Turin, Department of Management, as well as Adjunct Professor at ESCP Europe Business School, Turin Campus.

He is member of the Turin Bar and is also a member of several associations, including the Association of Law Professors of Economics (ADDE), the European Banking Institute (EBI), the European Society for Banking and Financial Law (AEDBF), and the European Corporate Governance Institute (ECGI).
